BUCKLAND INCLOSURE.

WE the Commissioners, appointed by an Act of Parliament lately passed, for Dividing, Allotting, and Inclosing the Common Fields, Common Meadows, Common Pastures, Downs, and all other the Commonable Lands and Waste Grounds in the Hamlet or Liberty of Buckland, in the Parish of Buckland, in the County of Berks, Do hereby give Notice, that by Virtue of an Act of Parliament, passed in the 41st Year of the Reign of his present Majesty King George the Third, and in Pursuance of the Powers thereby vested in us, we have appointed the several public Carriage Roads and Highways through and over the Lands and Grounds by the said first mentioned Act directed to be divided, allotted, and inclosed, and have caused me same to be set out by Stakes and Marks; and have also caused the general Lines of such Roads to be laid down on a Map, and deposited the same with our Clerks, who have left the same at the House of Sarah Brown, called the Rose and Crown, at Pusey Furze in the said Parish of Buckland, for the Inspection of all Persons concerned; and we do hereby appoint a Meeting to be held by us, the said Commissioners, on Thursday the 29th Day of July Inst. at Eleven o-Clock in the Forenoon, at the House of the said Sarah Brown, for the Purpose that all Persons who may think themselves aggrieved, or have any Objections to make to the said Roads so appointed, set out, staked and marked, or to the Omission in setting out any Road or Way, may attend and make the same.

PUBLIC CARRIAGE ROADS.

Faringdon towards London.

1. This Road to remain in its present Course and Direction, and of the Breadth of sixty Feet.

Bampton towards London.

2. This Road to remain in its present Course and Direction, and Branches out of the above-mentioned Road, at the Plantation adjoining the South West Comer of Barrow Hill Croft, belonging to Sir John Throckmorton, and to remain of the Breadth of forty Feet.

Buckland to Charney and other Places.

3. Beginning at the West End of Summer Side Street, in the Village of Buckland, and extending Southward, in its present Course, to the London Road, and after crossing that Road, then through and over the Common Fields and Buckland Downs to the Road next after described leading from Stanford to Pusey; and after crossing that Road, then extending South Eastward to a Gateway in the Boundary Fence of Ganfield Farm, which Road is to remain of the Breadth of forty Feet.

Stanford towards Pusey.

4. Beginning at the South East End of Stanford Lane, in the Parish of Hatford, and extending North Eastward, in its present Course, over Buckland Downs to its usual Entrance into the Parish of Pusey, which Road is to remain of the Breadth of forty Feet.

Buckland towards Bampton.

5. Beginning at the North West Comer of an old Inclosure called the Crofts, and extending from thence Westward till it meets the Turnpike Road to Bampton; which Road is to remain of the Breadth of forty Feet.
